LITERACY NEWS

5 Ways to Improve Reading

1. Set aside a regular time that everyone will read for 15 minutes. This could be before bed, while supper is cooking, right after school or a time that works best for your family.
2. Have a variety of reading material for your child. This can include magazines, comic books, storybooks, novels, books on tape or newspapers.
3. Include different literacy activities. This can include things like reading menus, recipes, directions of a game, roadside signs or maps.
4. Visit the local library as a family to choose books to read in a quiet place.
5. Set a family reading goal at home. When your family reaches the number of books or reading minutes plan a family celebration.

Literacy Tip:

Every minute of reading counts! Make the most out of those minutes waiting in the doctor's office by reading with your child. If you have 10 minutes while supper is cooking or in the mornings, use this time to read with your child. It keeps your child busy and develops literacy skills at the same time!

Alphabet matching is a great way to teach young children to recognize the letters of the alphabet. You can also have them practice matching uppercase and lower case letters. Once they can recognize the letters you can teach them the sounds of the letters.
